ALANA (African, Latinx, Asian, Native American, & Allies) is a student alliance that promotes cultural awareness, inclusion, diversity, and leadership. 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How to Get Involved

- Find a club that interests you.
- Read the morning announcements for information about when a club will begin meeting.
- Want to start a club? Pick up the necessary forms in the Assistant Principal's office. **Important:** All clubs require the approval of both the HS Principal and Student Senate before any meetings can begin. Additionally, the proposed club must have a BCHS faculty member as an advisor and a minimum of 17 BCHS students who are interested in participating.

Participation in School Activities is a Privilege

- Students are required to be in attendance at school on the day they participate in any facet of extracurricular activities. To receive credit for full-day attendance, students must be in school for at least half a day (4 periods).
- Students who are suspended from school (ISS and OSS) will be barred from all school functions (i.e., athletic events, dances, or other school events) on the day(s) of suspension or from the next scheduled function. Inappropriate behavior in extracurricular activities will result in a referral and corresponding disciplinary action.
- Thirty days before a special event (e.g., Homecoming, Snowball Dance, Junior Prom, Senior Ball, etc.,) students with three or more referrals and/or suspension will lose the privilege of attending the event.
